News from the Chair

It is with great sadness that we have to inform you of the passing of Barbara Earl our former Secretary and Chair of the society. She worked tirelessly for the society and the local community and will be greatly missed.

Her funeral will be held on 3rd March 2023 at St. Mary's Church, West Malling at 2pm.

In the boundary wall of Douces Manor, St Leonards Street, West Malling, was a seat popular with walkers whilst resting looking at the lovely views of the lake and Manor Park. Unfortunately, the seat has over time become unusable.

The Malling Society have discussed with the Douces Manor Estate and has agreed to replace the seat to Celebrate The Coronation of King Charles III on May 6th 2023.

West Malling Library has now reopened and as a reminder the opening times are as follows:

NuVenture Bus routes 58 and 70 will continue to run through and around West Malling until at least July 2023. Operator Nu Venture have, however, decided to offer a one day per week return shopper journey on both routes until July. They hope by then that the service will have become self-funding, or that KCC will agree to share its cost with affected Parish Councils.

On **Mondays from 13th February**, a route 70 service will run from Wrotham Square and Borough Green station to Offham, West Malling, Leybourne Chase, Lunsford Park Tesco, East Malling's King and Queen, and back to West Malling. This will give shoppers about 1 3/4 hours at Tesco and about 2 hours 20 minutes in West Malling.

On **Fridays from 17th February**, a route 58 bus will run from Borough Green station and Wrotham Square via Trottiscliffe Ryarsh, Birling, Leybourne, West Malling, East Malling and Larkfield to Maidstone along the A20. This allows two hours shopping in the town centre, but will not include the Hospital on the route.

Local plan Up Date.

The Borough Council has decided to pause the local plan process by not reporting back further as planned in March.

The Government have announced plans to revise national planning policy which if passed may affect the draft plan. They could mean it becomes harder to develop in the Green Belt and the housing figures for each area becoming less rigid and not mandatory as at present.

Borough planners say the next report back to a meeting is likely to be in the Summer.
