We are proud to share that the project received crucial funding from the UK Government through a generous grant from the Community Ownership Fund, administered by the Department for Levelling Up, Housing, and Communities. This grant, totalling £120,000, was pivotal in achieving the £150,000 purchase price.

The success of this project underscores the power of collective action.

It demonstrates what can be achieved when the community comes together with borough councillors, parish council, residents, and government financial support.

In securing these woods we are reminded of the immense value of our natural heritage and the significance of preserving it for the well-being of current and future generations.

Thank you to everyone who played a part in making this dream a reality. We are excited to embark on this new journey and safeguard Leybourne Woods for the enjoyment of all.

We will update the community as we work towards enhancing and protecting this beautiful natural space.

2. **Leybourne Castle Lake** is now in the ownership of Leybourne Parish Council and is undergoing a series of improvements, thanks to the dedicated efforts of local parishes.

One of the recent additions to the area is a new path and fence along the northern edge of the lake. This not only enhances safety but also provides a convenient and pleasant route for those looking to explore the area's natural beauty.

We are in the final stages of securing a fishing lease with SWS Fisheries. This lease is expected to improve the management of the lake and underscores the commitment to



preserving the ecological balance of the lake and maintaining it as a hub for recreational activities.

In addition to these developments, the community has rallied together to further enhance the lake's surroundings. A dedicated volunteer litter picker has already been active in keeping the area clean, and plans are underway to establish a volunteer's group. Looking ahead to the coming year, there are exciting plans to create a walkway near the lake along Oxley Shaw Lane. This will provide an even more convenient route for nature enthusiasts and those who simply wish to unwind by the water.

After decades of neglect, Castle Lake is set to become an even more inviting and accessible location for all to enjoy.

5. The Medway Queen outing



On June 13, a group of Malling Society members visited the paddle steamer, The Medway Queen, the Heroine of Dunkirk, for a guided tour at Gillingham Pier, where she is berthed.

We started with an introductory talk in the visitor centre, where the ship's story was displayed with photographs and artefacts and was told about her history. We then moved into the workshop where much of the preservation repairs are done, which was fascinating.

Then we went on board the ship itself, where we were able to see how much restoration has been done and learnt about her extraordinary history, including her role in World War 2 as a minesweeper and the amazing rescue of over 7000 troops from Normandy, although she was not designed for either role.

She subsequently had a very varied life as a pleasure craft, appeared in several movies and became a clubhouse, restaurant and nightclub at the Island Marina on the Isle of Wight. After many hard times, she came to her berth at Gillingham Pier, where she is being lovingly restored by the Medway Queen Preservation Society. The visit was most interesting and was rounded off with a cream tea.
